We welcome all our families back for our final term together. Over the last two weeks the **children have shown us just how independent they are becoming** and how helpful they are to the other children in the group. The staff are at risk of being redundant as the children step in to open snack boxes and turn taps on for their friends without being asked.

The children in both groups have enjoyed opportunities to use scissors at the collage table and we are constantly amazed at the **wonderful ideas they have as they get creative!**

We had observed that many of the boys weren't very interested in experiences with paint. That was until we introduced marbles to the paint. The children, particularly the boys have been waiting very patiently to get a chance to roll the paint around in the tray to make patterns with different colours. The playroom looks lovely with the results of this experience.

Wattle group can't get enough of **paper making** at the moment!! Our paper making/worm farm guru Julie Canobie came back for more!! We used tissue paper and dried flowers and there were many enthusiastic helpers.

Thank you to Bridie for helping the 3's make a **scarecrow** for our garden. We all had lots of fun stuffing and trying to dress him!! It is really important for the children to contribute to our garden and I appreciate all the help I get from such enthusiastic parents. It is this real love of contributing that makes our kindergarten the place to be.

We are looking forward to **celebrating Children's Week by welcoming the grandparents and any other special visitors to our kinder for morning tea on Thursday October 25 and Friday October 26**. It will be a privilege to have these special guests with us.

Our last kinder session with the children for the term will be on Thursday December 13 for the Gumnuts and Friday December 14 for the Wattles.

Term Four is the culmination of a busy and fun year, building family, children and staff relationships, exploring and nurturing the children's ideas and interests and facilitating each child's unique and special learning potential. We are looking forward to lots of exciting occasions and enjoying familiar and favourite experiences too.

The beginning of a new term is always an opportunity for the children to explore a changed learning environment. As we rearrange play spaces during the holidays, we try

to balance the need for group play with individual and pair play, the need for child to be able to initiate their own play and learning, and the need for teachers to be able to direct learning. We never cease to be amazed at how rearranging play spaces stimulate the children's play in so many new ways!

A major focus for the 4yo families and children, who will be moving onto school next year, is the beginning of the **transition process**. Most local schools now have their transition programs operating and at kinder we have started to prepare Transition Statements. Both educators and families contribute to the preparation of the Transition Statements and once completed, it is forwarded to schools to assist Prep teachers in getting to know the children who will be joining them. **The transition to school will be a key focus in our 4yo program in**

Term 4. Being responsive to the children's transition experiences is important in supporting the process to be positive one. Each child's and families experience during this time will be different, and we respect this.

The next couple of months brings all the children's skills together. Many children who began the year tentatively crossing the Balance board are now bouncing across it and competently climbing A frames and walking along ladders. Some children were not so enthusiastic about drawing and painting and are now presenting beautiful "stories" in pictures. Your children have learnt the skills of turn taking, and using numeracy and recognition of symbols and patterns to play board games. The world of Literacy has opened for the children, following the text in story books, writing and reading their names and practising letters and familiar words. We observe the joy on many children's faces as they experiment with science activities, cause and effect, solving problems and investigating interests. Our group times that began as a welcome and a story or dance time have now extended to group games, movement/music, discussion and some teacher directed learning activities. We are excited about celebrating your children's capabilities during our busy and exiting last term at kinder.

Coming up

St. Augustine's Anglican Kindergarten has organized and invited local pre schools to participate in an **exhibition of Sculptures designed and made by children** at our respective centres. This is an opportunity for children to work on a collaborative project together. Our children have been involved in discussion about ideas, design, material choices and construction of the sculpture. The fun "hands on" part of this project will now begin. Our Possum/Bellbird Sculpture will be on **display at the Box Hill Town Hall Monday 12th – 16th November.**

The children and staff are looking forward to our **Grandparents Day for the 4yo groups on Wednesday 24th October.** This will be an 'open session' with grandparents welcome to visit at any stage of the morning/afternoon. This is a special time for the children to share their favourite activities and Grandparents to remember their early school years.

On **Wednesday 7th November staff from Healthways will visit the 4yo children to run a Water Safety Presentation.** This is a fun and interactive presentation which aims to increase the children's awareness of water safety both at home and importantly by pools and at the beach.

We are very excited about our end of year excursion to the **Melbourne Zoo on Wednesday 5th December.** Both Bellbirds and Possums groups along with Parent helpers will travel by bus to the Zoo and take part in an interactive and informative Educational session led by Zoo educators. We will spend some time enjoying a wander around our beautiful zoo and visit a selection of the children's favourite animals that we have previously talked and learnt about at kinder.

The 4yo team looks forward to sharing the last term with you and your children. We will celebrate in December with a singing celebration with families and party day for the children. We as educators look back on a rich and engaging year and are always amazed and indeed proud of how far all these little people have come.

Blackburn Preschool AGM and Parent Information Night is coming up on **Thursday 8th November**. You will also have the opportunity to meet your child's teacher, learn more about their kinder program, and meet other families.

On the night, the 2012 members of the Committee of Management will resign their positions and **new members will be elected for 2013**. The COM is the only managerial structure at the Preschool, so it is essential to its operations and without a COM we are legally not able to open the kinder. Committee positions are taken up by parents or guardians, on a voluntary basis, who meet monthly to discuss, and make decisions about, the business of the Preschool; and who then undertake the specific duties of their role. Being part of the Committee of Management is a great way to make a valuable contribution to our kinder and to make new friends! **For those families continuing on with us next year, we would encourage you to consider putting your name down for a Committee position.** We always welcome new members!

CareMonkey is a safe and free web app for sharing health care information. Asthma Australia has partnered with CareMonkey in order to contribute to the safety and well-being of people with asthma. Parents can create a profile for their child in CareMonkey which can be shared with trusted carers, including family, friends, teachers and sports coaches.

Vital information such as emergency contacts, health and safety alerts, medications, allergy details, asthma plan and more can be easily shared.

Holiday and Festival Asthma Trigger Warning

The upcoming holiday season and festivities planned during Term 4 and throughout the summer holidays may mean that your child is exposed to new triggers for their asthma. It is important for parents and carers, and children themselves, to be aware of changes to their environment and the activities that may impact on their asthma.

Christmas trees, both real and artificial could be triggers for people with asthma. Artificial trees may be quite dusty after being stored away, while both real and artificial trees may harbour mould. It is important to ensure that artificial trees are cleaned appropriately and that care is taken to select real trees that do not produce wind-borne pollen. All tree and other decorations should be cleaned and free from dust and mould when used at home.

Scented candles, room deodorisers and air fresheners may also trigger asthma in those susceptible to perfumes, and care should be taken when purchasing these and other scented items at home.

Lastly, the added pressures of the year drawing to a close can cause stress and anxiety for many people, potentially triggering asthma attacks. It is important to consider ways that the whole family can enjoy the holidays and feel safe, happy and comfortable.
